### What are we learning?

#### **Key Themes and books**

Farms and New Life











#### **Key Experiences**

The children will learn about animals found on farms; their names, the sounds they make, the name of their young. They will have the experience of meeting real life animals with Ark Farm visiting the school.

#### **Key Vocabulary**

Adult farm names and their young e.g. cow and calf. Under, over, beside, through. Cross, Palm Sunday, egg, pancake, flip, toss, mix

#### **PSED**

- Class rules: Behavioural expectations in the class/boundaries set
- Adapt behaviour when there are changes in routine.
- Can manage self-care and dressing routines with increasing proficiency.
- Can play in a group with friends suggesting ideas.

#### CLL

- Asks simple questions related to the story.
- Can answer simple questions about themselves.
- Follows instructions without visual clues.
- Describe events that have already happened although tenses may not accurate.

#### PD

- Able to use one handed tools and equipment with control.
- Has spatial awareness when running or riding a tricycle.
- Moves with confidence in a range of ways developing core strength, balance, coordination.

#### Maths

- Prepositions under, over, through, besides, above.
- Explores number in play with growing purpose.
- When combining materials knows how to change an amount (size, number) if something is added or taken away.
- Is able to anticipate which amount will be next in the context of one more/one less number songs/rhymes.

#### UW

- Shows care and concern for living things and the environment.
- Can document in age appropriate ways, for example simple drawings, 'maps', models and constructions of landmarks of personal interest.
- Talks about and responds to events/experiences and interests in their lives, building on relevant vocabulary

#### Literacy

- Knows that print carries meaning.
- Recognises familiar signs and labels, and their own name.
- Uses their own illustrations or props to retell a story.
- Recognises and writes some letters from their own name.

#### EAD

- Demonstrates creativity and imagination, constructs with a purpose in mind using a variety of resources to create models, props and simple stories. Creations are used in independent play.
- In play, recounts or makes up songs, rhymes and simple stories. Starting to create a dance/own music to support selfexpression.
