Oxford Reading Levels is a system used to determine the level of many popular primary reading books from Oxford.

This chart shows how the levels map to children's typical progress through primary school, although different children will progress at different rates and reach different points at the end of each year.

Why Levels 8–12 overlap?

One unique feature of Oxford Reading Levels is the consideration of text difficulty and children's emotional maturity. Having Levels 8-12 in Year 2/Primary 3, and in Year 3/Primary 4 means that we are able to provide suitable books for very capable 6-7 year olds and books that are less challenging but still age-appropriate for older children who are reluctant and/or slower to progress.
