Read Write Inc. Phonics


For children who are due to start Reception class in September.

Many of you may already be following the Read Write Inc. link on the website to phonics. For information below is a table for the first set of sounds that your child will learn in Reception class. Remember please do not use letter names at this stage, just the sound. For further help on saying the sound can be found on YouTube.

The 'Rhyme' column is what children say as they write the sound. It is good to familiarise your child with the rhyme also.

As your child becomes more confident and familiar with the sounds, you can sound out words. Early words that children sound out are called CVC words (consonant, vowel, consonant words). Examples could be d-a-d, c-a-t, m-a-d, n-e-t

The key to learning phonics is keeping these types of activity fun and short, no more than 5 or 10 minutes max. If your child would rather do something else please do not panic, try another day.
