Н	Isolation of contacts will be carried out by NHS Test and Trace, though you may be asked to identify contacts in the case of a local outbreak. Н	Face coverings are no longer required in schools.  Schools have the freedom to allow students and staff to continue wearing facemasks if they feel it is appropriate to do so.	<ul> <li>We will continue to ask parents to wear face masks on dropping and collecting children.</li> <li>This cannot be enforced and we will not approach parents if they do not have a face mask on.</li> </ul>	
Н	Frequent and thorough hand cleaning should now be regular practice. You should continue to ensure that pupils clean their hands regularly. This can be done with soap and water or hand sanitiser.	<ul> <li>We will continue to ask children to wash hands on entry to school and at regular intervals during the day. This will be interspersed with the use of hand sanitiser where appropriate</li> <li>Posters supporting children on how to do this properly will be displayed around school</li> <li>All staff will model for the children the correct way to wash hands and regularly remind children to do so.</li> </ul>	-
Н	PPE  PPE beyond what is required for your normal day to day job is no longer required unless very close contact is required with somebody displaying symptoms of Covid-19.	We will continue to provide PPE for all staff and would encourage it to be used if deemed appropriate.  L  L	
Н	Cleaning  Cleaning schedule to remain in place including regular cleaning of areas and equipment with a particular focus on frequently touched surfaces.	<ul> <li>We will continue to have our regular cleaning in school</li> <li>Throughout the day staff will be aware of key touch points in school especially in the classroom eg. door handles and any shared equipment eg. PE</li> <li>Staff will be responsible for any shared items that they use/touch across school and be asked to wipe surfaces after use eg. kettles/staff room equipment, telephones</li> </ul>	
H	Ventilation  When school is in operation, it is important to ensure it is well ventilated and that a comfortable teaching environment is maintained.  Fresh air flow will be ensured when holding events where visitors such as parents are on site, for example school plays.	<ul> <li>Windows within classrooms will remain open within reasons</li> <li>Doors into the corridors will also remain open when possible</li> <li>Areas which have limited windows eg. the hall, will always have external and internal doors open</li> <li>Any aircon/fan systems will be adjusted accordingly to ensure that air is circulated</li> </ul>	-

	Opening external windows can improve natural ventilation, and in addition, opening internal doors can also assist with creating a throughput of air. If necessary, external opening doors may also be used (if they are not fire doors and where safe to do so).  Balance the need for increased ventilation while maintaining a comfortable temperature	The opening of windows will be monitored as we move into the colder season in order to ensure the comfort of children and staff		
Н	Managing cases of Covid-19 within school  If anyone develops Covid-19 symptoms, however mild, they will be sent home.  For everyone with symptoms, they should avoid using public transport and, wherever possible, be collected by a member of their family or household.  If a pupil is awaiting collection, they should be left in a room on their own if possible and safe to do so. A window should be opened for fresh air ventilation if possible. Appropriate PPE should also be used if close contact is necessary.  The household (including any siblings) should follow the PHE stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed Covid-19 infection.	<ul> <li>All staff have a clear understanding of Covid- 19 symptoms and what to look out for. Н	Admitting children who are displaying symptoms  In most cases, parents and carers will agree that a pupil with symptoms should not attend the school, given the potential risk to others. If a parent or carer insists on a pupil attending your school, we can take the decision to reuse the pupil, in our reasonable judgement, it is necessary to protect other pupils and staff from possible infection with Covid-19. This decision would need to be carefully considered in light of all the circumstances and current public health advice	<ul> <li>A clear understanding between parents and school on what are symptoms and when school will not admit pupils. this will be communicated regularly to all parents. H	Asymptomatic Testing  Staff will continue to test twice a week until the end of September using home lateral flow testing kits.  Staff with a positive LFD test should self-isolate in line with the stay at home guidance. They will also need to get a PCR test to check if they have Covid-19.  Whilst awaiting the PCR result, the individual should continue to self-isolate.	•	Staff will be encouraged to continue taking twice weekly lateral flow tests until end of September Guidance will be shared with staff regularly in order to support a consistent approach across school Should staff have a positive LFD test they will isolate immediately and obtain a PCR test. Staff will remain in isolation pending the result of the PCR test	Yes	L
	If the PCR test is taken within 2 days of the positive lateral flow test, and is negative, it overrides the self-test LFD test and the pupil can return to school, as long as they individual doesn't have Covid-19 symptoms.				
Н	Clinically Extremely vulnerable children and young people  All CEV children and young people will attend school unless they are one of the very small number of children and young people under paediatric or other specialist care who have been advised by their GP or clinician not to attend.	•	Support will be given to families with CEV children	Yes	Г
Н	Educational Visits  Given the likely gap in Covid-19 related cancellation insurance, if we are considering booking a new visit, whether domestic or international, you will ensure that any new bookings have adequate financial protect in place.  We should undertake full and thorough risk assessments in relation to all educational visits and ensure that any public health advice, such as hygiene and ventilation requirements, is included as part of that risk assessment.
